

After School Positively Impacts Regular School Day Attendance

Did You Know?

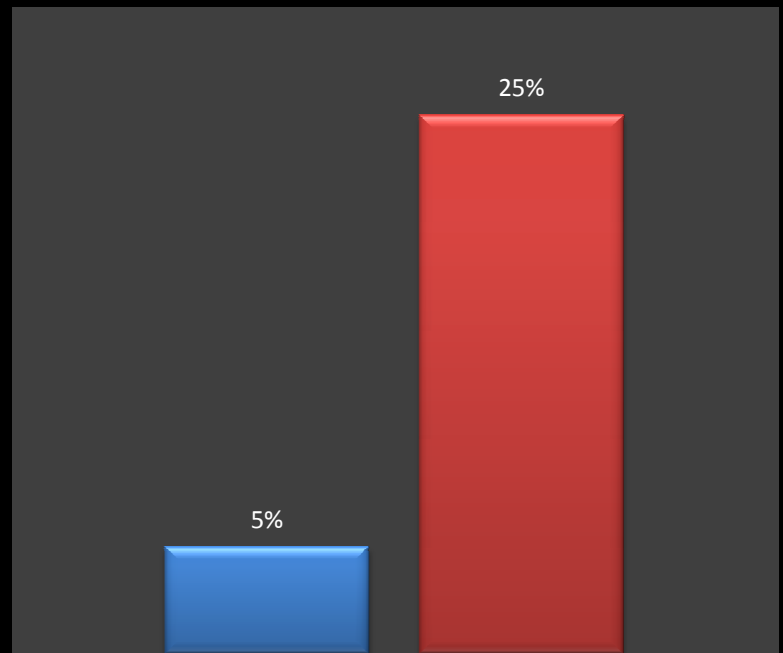
25% of all elementary students in CA missed school 18 days in SY12-13.*

During this same time, only 5% of students in SD County's ASES programs were chronically absent.

ASES students who were chronically absent became less so the more they attended the after school program within a one-year period.

Percent of Chronically Absent Students

A statically significant correlation. An important finding as the chronically absent students underperformed academically (< 15%) when compared to their peers in ASES.

*Missing 10% of a typical school year is considered to be chronically absent.
